

5 Steps to Obtaining Your Arkansas Journeyman Plumber's License

Step 1. Sign up for the exam.

Qualifications: Arkansas law requires contractors to be licensed. Applicants must have at least 4 years of experience or apprenticeship to qualify for the Arkansas Journeyman license. The first step in the Licensing process is to submit a completed application to the State Plumbing Board. Upon approval you will receive a letter stating that you may take the exam. All candidates must request a licensure package from:

The Journeyman Plumber is not required to take the Business and Law Exam.

Scheduling: The Arkansas Plumbing Board gives the exam once per month.

Exam Fees: The journeyman plumber exam costs \$75, and the license costs \$75.

Step 2. Purchase the required books for your exam.

You must purchase these documents and books in preparation for the exam and bring them with you on testing day for the open book portions of the exam.

Step 3. Start studying!

To fully prepare for your exam it is best to thoroughly study the required documents and books, as well as any recommended studying materials. The amount of preparation time needed will be different for each individual. Be sure to allow yourself enough time to fully prepare for the exam.

Step 4. Follow the rules.

Candidates should bring the following items to the examination:

- Admission Letter;
- Current, government-issued photo ID, such as a driver's license or passport;
- Silent, battery powered or solar powered calculator. No tape-producing calculators are allowed;
- Two sharpened No. 2 pencils;
- Approved reference materials.

Step 5. Good luck on the exam!

It is best that you arrive at the examination site at least 30 minutes prior to your scheduled exam time on the day of testing.

The **Journeyman Plumber Exam** is an open-book test with 50 questions and a 4-hour time limit. The exam is divided into four sections: Drawings, Multiple-Choice Questions, Code Illustrations, and matching items with descriptions.
