

5 Steps to Obtaining Your District of Columbia Journeyman Refrigeration/AC Mechanic's License

Step 1. Sign up for the exam.

Qualifications: To qualify to sit for this exam you must have proof that you have completed an apprenticeship program. Once you complete an application to take the exam and it has been approved, you will be sent the necessary information to register for the exam.

Exam and License Fees: There is an \$85 fee to take this exam. Once you pass the exam, there is an additional \$150 non-refundable application and license application fee.

Step 2. Purchase the required books for your exam.

You must purchase these documents and books in preparation for the exam and bring them with you on testing day for the open book portions of the exam.

Step 3. Start studying!

To fully prepare for your exam it is best to thoroughly study the required documents and books, as well as any recommended studying materials. The amount of preparation time needed will be different for each individual. Be sure to allow yourself enough time to fully prepare for the exam.

Step 4. Follow the rules.

Candidates should bring the following items to the examination:

- Current, valid, government-issued photo ID, such as a driver's license or passport;
- Admission letter;

- Silent, battery powered or solar powered calculator. No tape-producing calculators are allowed;
- Approved reference materials.

Step 5. Good luck on the exam!

It is best that you arrive at the examination site at least 30 minutes prior to your scheduled exam time on the day of testing.
