

5 Steps To Obtaining Your Montana Journeyman Plumber's License

Step 1. Sign up for the exam.

Application: To do plumbing work in Montana you must have a license. To apply for a license, contact:

You will have to pass an exam to get a master or journeyman's license. The exam is given by Experior. Practice exams are available for \$25. For information on the exam, contact:

Qualifications: To apply for a journeyman plumber's license you must prove you have five years of practical plumbing work experience or have a voucher completed by an active licensed master plumber.

Exam/license fees: There is a \$30 license application fee and the exam fee is \$95. Please note that Montana does not reciprocate master license.

Step 2. Purchase the required books for your exam.

To find out what documents and books the State of Montana requires for this exam, follow this link to your state's exam page of our website:

<http://www.constructionbook.com/contractor-license/montana/index.asp>. You must purchase these documents and books in preparation for the exam and, if applicable, bring them with you on testing day for the open book portions of the exam.

Step 3. Start studying!

To fully prepare for your exam it is best to thoroughly study the required documents and books, as well as any recommended studying materials. The amount of preparation time needed will be different for each individual. Be sure to allow yourself enough time to fully prepare for the exam.

Step 4. Follow the rules.

Your first responsibility as an examinee is to arrive at the exam site on the proper date, at least 30 minutes prior the exam's scheduled start time, and with your exam confirmation number and proper photo identification (issued by a state or federal regulatory agency).

NO personal items will be permitted in the testing center. Examinees will not be allowed to bring or use reference books other than those indicated on the examination outline. Along

with the approved reference books, candidates must also bring a watch without an alarm, and a non-programmable, battery-operated calculator.

Step 5. Good luck on the exam!

The Journeyman Plumber's exam tests a candidate's knowledge of the installation, repair, maintenance, and extension of any plumbing system, including drains, waste, sanitary vents, water supply, fixtures, and indirect wastes. Candidates must answer 70% correct in order to be considered passing.

The exam is made up of 100 questions over a three-hour time limit and covers the following subjects:
