

5 Steps To Obtaining Your North Dakota Master Plumber's License

Step 1. Sign up for the exam.

Application: To do plumbing work in North Dakota, you need to be licensed as a journeyman or master plumber. To get an application, contact:

Qualifications: You must pass an exam to get a license. To qualify for the master exam you need two years of work experience as a licensed journeyman plumber in North Dakota or any other state that has a state licensing law. If you have a valid master license in another state, you can use it to apply for a master exam.

Once the applicant has been approved, the applicant will be sent an Examination Invitation. Applicant will be allowed to choose the date he or she wishes to take the exam.

Exam/license fees: The exam and master license costs \$200.

Step 2. Purchase the required books for your exam.

<http://www.constructionbook.com/contractor-license/north-dakota/index.asp>. You must purchase these documents and books in preparation for the exam and, if applicable, bring them with you on testing day for the open book portions of the exam.

Step 3. Start studying!

To fully prepare for your exam it is best to thoroughly study the required documents and books, as well as any recommended studying materials. The amount of preparation time needed will be different for each individual. Be sure to allow yourself enough time to fully prepare for the exam.

Step 4. Follow the rules.

Your first responsibility as an examinee is to arrive at the exam site on the proper date, at least 30 minutes prior the exam's scheduled start time, and with your exam confirmation number and proper photo identification (issued by a state or federal regulatory agency).

NO personal items will be permitted in the testing center. Examinees will not be allowed to bring or use reference books other than those indicated on the examination outline. Along with the approved reference books, candidates must also bring a watch without an alarm, and a non-programmable, battery-operated calculator.

Step 5. Good luck on the exam!

The exam will ask you questions about basic plumbing principles and the state plumbing code. You'll be asked to draw stacks, wastes, vents, and minimum pipe sizes on drawings that already have plumbing fixtures on them.
